## Brush

The City will pick up loose brush that is no longer than 6 feet and no larger than 6 inches in diameter.

## Grass Clippings

The City will not be sucking up grass clippings due to damage the clippings cause to the equipment.

## Bulk Items

Ace Environmental will collect one bulk item less than 50 pounds per week. Collection of other bulk items should be scheduled by contacting Ace at 864-877-0505.

## Reminders

### Yard Debris

The City does not pick up loose grass clippings and other yard debris. Yard waste must be bagged for Ace Environmental to collect.

### Leaves

Leaves should be bagged for Ace Environmental to collect June-September. The City will resume loose leaf collection Oct. 1st.

## Reminders for Outdoor Burning



Outdoor burning is **prohibited** for homeowners except for the following provisions in the Code of Ordinances:

**Food preparation:** Outdoor burning in connection with the preparation of food for immediate consumption in a device or place designated for preparation is allowed.

**Outdoor recreational burning:** Provided it meets the International Fire Code Section 307 within the city

limits, outdoor recreational burning is allowed. The provisions are as follows:

1. Separation distance from combustible material
2. Constant attendance
3. Extinguishment ability
